BILL TOPIC: REVISE MEDICAID FRAUD REPORTING

Summary of Legislation

Recommended by the Joint Budget Committee, the bill requires the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing (HCPF) to consolidate existing statutory reports on Medicaid client and provider fraud into a single comprehensive report. This report must contain an estimate of the net cost-effectiveness of fraud detection and recovery efforts.

Background

In recent years, HCPF has provided an analysis of the net cost-effectiveness of fraud detection and recovery efforts as part of a non-statutory annual request for information sent from the Joint Budget Committee to the Governor.

Assessment

Given that the information in the comprehensive report is already reported annually by HCPF, this bill is assessed as having no fiscal impact.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect August 9, 2017, if the General Assembly adjourns on May 10, 2017, as scheduled, and no referendum petition is filed.
