	CONCERNING THE APPROVAL BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE SPEAKER'S APPOINTMENT OF ANNIE KAO TO FILL THE HOUSE APPOINTEE VACANCY ON THE INDEPENDENT ETHICS
	COMMISSION.
	WHEREAS, Section 5 (2)(a)(II) of article XXIX of the state
	constitution requires the Colorado House of Representatives to appoint
	one member to the Independent Ethics Commission created in section 5
	(1) of said article, hereafter referred to as the "Commission", and section
	24-18.5-101 (2)(a), Colorado Revised Statutes, directs the Speaker of the
	House of Representatives to appoint that member with the approval of
	two-thirds of the members elected to the House of Representatives; and
	WHEREAS, Pursuant to the authority granted to the Speaker of the
	House of Representatives under section 24-18.5-101 (2)(a), Colorado
	Revised Statutes, Speaker KC Becker appointed, and by approval of
	House Resolution 19-1010, the members of the House of Representatives
	approved the appointment of Debra Johnson to serve a four-year term as
	the House appointee to the Commission, commencing July 1, 2019; and

WHEREAS, On May 23, 2021, Commissioner Johnson gave

3	WHEREAS, Section 5 (2)(e) of article XXIX of the state
4	constitution provides that, when a member of the Commission is
5	appointed to fill an unexpired term, that member's term ends at the same
6	time as the term of the person being replaced; and
7	WHEREAS, Pursuant to his authority, Speaker Alec Garnett has
8	appointed Annie Kao to fill the vacancy occasioned by the resignation of
9	Debra Johnson from the Commission, effective July 1, 2021, to serve as
10	the House appointee to the Commission for the remainder of the
11	unexpired term through June 30, 2023; and
12	WHEREAS, Ms. Kao, who is affiliated with the Democratic Party,
13	is the founder of Ascent Inclusion Consulting, an entity focused on
14	providing guidance for the advancement of inclusion, equity, and
15	diversity in the outdoor industry and the outdoor recreation economy,
16	bringing together people of all abilities, races, ethnicities, genders, and
17	diverse backgrounds and identities in the pursuit of an outdoors for all;

19	WHEREAS, The establishment of Ascent Inclusion Consulting has
20	provided Ms. Kao the opportunity to combine her legal education and
21	experience with her personal love of the outdoors and her passion for and
22	expertise in advancing diversity, equity, and inclusion in the outdoor
23	industry and recreation economy; and
24	WHEREAS, From 2010 to 2020, Ms. Kao served as in-house
25	counsel for Vail Resorts, including as Assistant General Counsel
26	Mountain Resorts and as lead operations attorney for several world-class
27	resorts, including Vail, Beaver Creek, Breckenridge, Keystone, and
28	Whistler Blackcomb; and
29	WHEREAS, Prior to her work with Vail Resorts, Ms. Kao was a
30	commercial trial attorney in Denver at the law firms of Hogan Lovells
31	from 2008 to 2010 and at Brownstein Hyatt Farber Schreck from 2003 to
32	2008, following a judicial clerkship with Chief Justice Mary J. Mullarkey
33	of the Colorado Supreme Court from 2002 to 2003; and
34	WHEREAS, Ms. Kao advanced the interests of Asian Pacific
35	American legal professionals in her capacity as a Regional Governor of

the National Asian Pacific American Bar Association from 2007 to 2009 and subsequently as the Secretary of the Association from 2009 to 2010, and as the President of the Asian Pacific American Bar Association of Colorado from 2007 to 2008; and

WHEREAS, Because of her personal life experiences, her extensive legal training and experience, her understanding and respect for others, and her unique ability to connect and communicate with a wide variety of audiences, Ms. Kao has inspired positive change in a variety of industries, fostering open dialogue geared toward building an essential foundation of understanding, trust, and respect; and

WHEREAS, Through her volunteer efforts, similarly focused on advancing diversity, equity, and inclusion in the outdoor industry and recreation economy, Ms. Kao serves as a Board Member of and Secretary for the Share Winter Foundation, a grant-making and resource hub whose mission is to improve the lives, health, and fitness of youth through winter sports by creating a more diverse, inclusive, and welcoming winter sports community; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Kao has been invited to be a guest lecturer at the University of Colorado Boulder's Leeds School of Business and Colorado Mesa University's outdoor recreation industries studies program, and to serve as a partner to the Outdoor Industry Master of Business Administration program at Western Colorado University because of her ability to educate, motivate, and inspire others; and

WHEREAS, On the basis of her dedicated service to the betterment of her community, her considerable legal knowledge and experience, and her undisputed reputation as an individual of integrity and compassion, Annie Kao has demonstrated the temperament and personal qualities that will enable her to serve as a respected member of the Colorado Independent Ethics Commission in an exemplary manner and in a way that will reflect well upon the House of Representatives, the Colorado General Assembly, and the State of Colorado; now, therefore,

Be It Further Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Seventy-third General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

That the House of Representatives hereby approves Speaker Garnett's appointment of Annie Kao to fill the vacancy occasioned by the resignation of Debra Johnson as the House appointee to the Independent
