Effective Date: The bill was deemed lost in the House of Representatives during Second Reading on May 9, 2012, when the General Assembly adjourned sine die without taking final action.

Summary of Legislation

This bill appropriates funds from the Colorado Water Conservation Board (CWCB) Construction Fund for specific water-related projects in FY 2012-13. The bill also:

- transfers funding from the Perpetual Base Account of the Severance Tax Trust Fund to the CWCB Construction Fund to fund two projects;
- clarifies that the State Engineer is authorized to receive and expend contributions from the CWCB;
- changes the Water Supply Reserve Account to the Water Supply Reserve Fund; and
- requires the Interbasin Compact Committee to submit an annual report to the House Committee on Agriculture, Livestock, and Natural Resources, and the Senate Committee on Agriculture, Natural Resources, and Energy on the status of interbasin compact negotiations and how moneys from the Water Supply Reserve Fund were allocated.

Background

The CWCB Construction Fund was created in 1971 to provide low-interest loans for water projects. Revenues for this revolving loan fund come from interest earned on outstanding loans and the fund's cash balance and royalty distributions from federal mineral leases.

State Transfers

In FY 2012-13, FY 2013-14, and FY 2014-15, the bill transfers funding from the Perpetual Base Account of the Severance Tax Trust Fund to the CWCB Construction Fund for the Rio Grande cooperative project and the Chatfield Reservoir reallocation project. Each project will receive transfers in two installments.

Rio Grande cooperative project transfers:

- \$15,000,000 will be transferred on July 1, 2012 (FY 2012-13), and
- \$15,000,000 will be transferred on July 1, 2013 (FY 2013-14);

Chatfield Reservoir reallocation project:

- \$5,000,000 will be transferred on January 1, 2013 (FY 2012-13), and
- \$8,000,000 will be transferred on July 1, 2014 (FY 2014-15).

State Expenditures

This bill spends \$28,650,857 in FY 2012-13 from the CWCB Construction Fund. The projects for which moneys are appropriated are shown in Table 1.
