**TITLE:** CONCERNING THE REPEAL OF OBSOLETE ENTITIES.

**Summary of Legislation**

The bill repeals several government entities deemed to be obsolete for various reasons and makes conforming amendments. These entities, which have been deemed obsolete because of significant period of inactivity, lack of appointees, fulfillment of duties, or prior transfer of functions to other entities, include the following:

- State Standards and Assessments Development and Implementation Council (Department of Education);
- Microenterprise Development Advisory Council (Office of Economic Development and International Trade);
- Gulf War Syndrome Advisory Committee (Department of Public Health and Environment);
- Statewide Poison Control Oversight Board (Department of Public Health and Environment);
- expert panel for the creation of Centennial Care Choices Program (Department of Health Care Policy and Financing); and
- Minerals, Energy, and Geology Policy Advisory Board (Department of Natural Resources).

The bill was signed into law by the Governor on April 8, 2013, and takes effect August 7, 2013, assuming no referendum petition is filed.

**Assessment**

The repeal of the entities listed above will not affect state revenue or expenditures and, as such, the bill is assessed as having no fiscal impact.
