Summary of Legislation

The bill adds 2 members to the State Board of Chiropractic Examiners, increasing the total board membership to 7 members. Of the 2 new members, 1 member must be a practicing chiropractor in Colorado and the other must be a member of the public. Thus, under the bill, the board will be made up of 5 practicing chiropractors and 2 members of the public.

State Expenditures

The bill increases costs in the Department of Regulatory Agencies (DORA) by \$2,100 per year beginning in FY 2013-14, paid from the Division of Professions and Occupations Cash Fund. These costs are for per diem (\$50 per meeting) and travel expenses (\$100 per meeting) for 2 additional members of the board. The board meets 7 times per year, resulting in \$2,100 in new costs for adding the 2 board members (2 members x 7 meetings x \$150). The DORA will also have a minimal increase in workload to recruit and train the new members.

State Appropriations

For FY 2013-14, the DORA requires an appropriation of \$2,100 from the Division of Professions and Occupations Cash Fund.
