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PHARMACISTS TO SERVE AS PRACTITIONERS Bill Topic:

This bill clarifies pharmacists' scope of practice in regards to prescribing medication in certain situations. It will minimally increase state workload on an ongoing basis.

**Appropriation** Summary:

No appropriation is required.

**Fiscal Note** Status:

The fiscal note reflects the introduced bill.

### **Summary of Legislation**

This bill clarifies that a licensed and qualified pharmacist may serve as a practitioner for the purposes of prescribing over-the-counter medication under Medicaid or participating in a statewide drug therapy protocol pursuant to a collaborative pharmacy practice agreement.

#### **State Expenditures**

This bill increases workload in the Department of Regulatory Agencies by a minimal amount starting in FY 2018-19. Staff in the Division of Professions and Occupations will be required to update rules, communicate with pharmacists about the changes in the bill, and potentially receive and process complaints about pharmacists. It is assumed that this workload can be accomplished within existing appropriations.

#### **Effective Date**

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.
