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Bill Topic: VETERANS EMPLOYMENT PREFERENCE BY PRIVATE EMPLOYER

- Summary of Fiscal Impact: State Revenue, State Expenditure (potential, minimal), State Transfer, TABOR Refund, Local Government, Statutory Public Entity

This bill allows private employers to give preference to military veterans in hiring, promoting, or retention. The bill creates a potential and minimal workload increase beginning in FY 2019-20.

Appropriation Summary: No appropriation is required.

Fiscal Note Status: The fiscal note reflects the introduced bill.

Summary of Legislation

This bill allows private employers to give preference to military veterans and National Guard members in hiring, promoting, or retaining a veteran over another equally qualified applicant or employee as long as certain conditions are met.

State Expenditures

Beginning in FY 2019-20, the Department of Labor and Employment may have a minimal increase in workload to respond to employer and applicant questions about the veteran's preference employment policy.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect August 2, 2019, if the General Assembly adjourns on May 3, 2019, as scheduled, and no referendum petition is filed.
