Summary Information

Overview. The bill deletes obsolete terms and replaces them with "behavioral health safety net providers".

Summary of Legislation

The bill removes the obsolete terms “community mental health center” and “community mental health clinic” and replaces them with “behavioral health safety net providers”.

Assessment of No Fiscal Impact

[House Bill 22-1278](#), defined “behavioral health safety net provider” to encompass approved community mental health centers. Because the Behavioral Health Administration and other state departments have been operating under this definition of “behavioral health safety net providers,” the bill is codifying current practice and has no fiscal impact on state or local government.

Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor on May 30, 2025, and takes effect on August 6, 2025, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
